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Dear Rialto Families:

The California Department of Education announced in early April flexibility for administering state summative tests. Students in remote learning may have difficulty meeting the technology requirements of standardized testing. In such cases, districts can administer a more viable assessment option as long as it is based on state standards and meets other specific criteria.

This year, students in grades K - 8 will take the following tests May 3rd through May 21st:

- iReady English Language Arts (ELA)
- iReady Mathematics

The iReady ELA and mathematics assessments have been determined to be the most viable assessment option for these grade levels this school year. The diagnostics are online tests that measure what your child knows and is able to do. Results help identify gaps in knowledge or skills early on so your child can get the support he or she needs to be successful in school. In most cases, students will take the iReady diagnostic tests at home. Please do not assist your child as they complete the diagnostic. We need an accurate reflection of your child's abilities.

Results will be mailed home after our testing window closes. Score Reports will include an overall score, previous Fall and Winter scores if your child took the diagnostics earlier this year, and a description of your child's achievement.
