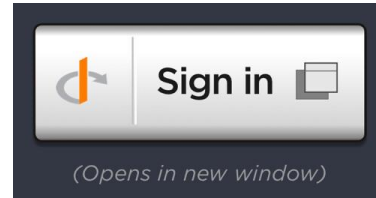

Role of the Council

The School Site Council is required, under state law, to serve as the school community representative body for determining the focus of the school's academic instructional program and all its related categorical resources. The School Site Council has responsibility for these duties:

- Develop and approve the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)
- Obtain recommendations for the proposed SPSA from all stakeholders and any applicable school advisory committees (Ed Code 64001)
- Develop and approve the plan and related expenditures in accordance with all state and federal laws and regulations
- Recommend the plan and expenditures to the governing board for approval

Role of the Council cont.

- Provide ongoing review of the implementation of the plan with the principal, teachers, and other school staff members
 - Make modifications to the plan whenever the need arises
 - Submit the modified plan for governing board approval whenever a material change (as defined in district governing board policy) is made in planned activities or related expenditures
 - Annually, (and at each semester, trimester, etc.), evaluate the progress made toward school goals to raise the academic achievement of all students
 - Carry out all other duties assigned to the council by the district governing board and by state law

Size and Composition

The council shall be composed of the following members, and half the representation on the council shall be from the school staff. This council half will include:


- (1) Principal
- (4) Teachers elected by other teachers and an alternate (Note: Classroom teachers shall constitute the majority of those persons representing the school staff) - *each member has equal voting rights*
- (1) Other school personnel elected by other school personnel and an alternate
- (3) Parents elected by other parents
- (3) Students elected by the entire student body or as otherwise designated in the Student Body By-laws (EC 52852)

Officers Duties

The officers of the council shall be: chairperson, vice-chairperson, secretary, parliamentarian and other officers the council may deem desirable. All officers are elected by the entire membership of the SSC.

Duties of Officers

Chairperson shall:

- Preside at all meetings of the council
 - Sign all letters, reports and other communications of the council
 - Perform all duties corresponding to the office of chairperson
 - Have other such duties as are prescribed by the council
- 

Officers Duties cont.

Vice-Chairperson shall:

- Represent the chairperson in assigned duties
- Substitute for the chairperson in his or her absence

Secretary shall:

- Keep minutes of all regular and special meetings of the council
- Transmit true and correct copies of the minutes of such meetings to members of the council
- Provide all notices in according with these bylaws
- Be custodian of the records of the council
- Keep a register of the names, addresses and telephone numbers of each member of the council, the chairpersons of the school advisory committees, and others with whom the council has regular dealings, as furnished by those persons.

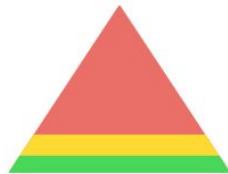

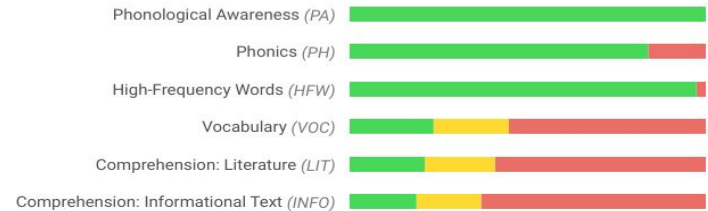


