What is Financial Aid?

Financial Aid

Financial Aid is any form of funding that helps pay you for college.

There are generally two ways to qualify for aid: through financial need and through merit.

- **Need-based aid:** The federal government calculates your financial need based on the information you provide on the FAFSA. Work-study dollars and most grants are need-based.
- **Merit-based aid:** Colleges and private organizations award scholarships to students with academic, athletic or artistic talent.



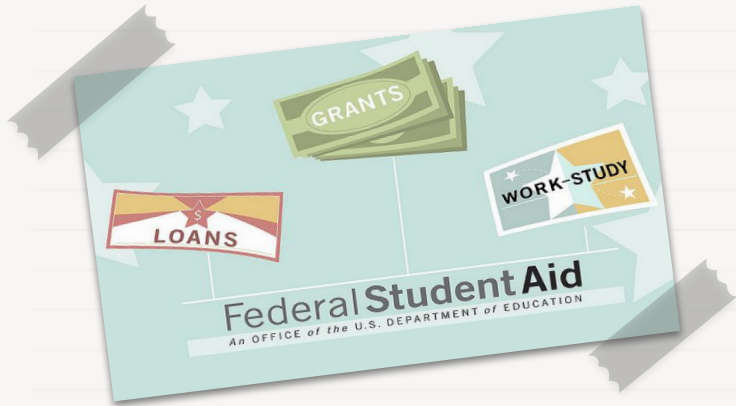

Types of Financial Aid

Types of Financial Aid...



- **Scholarship**
 - An award or payment made to support a students' education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement.
 - University Money determined by academic ability.
- **Grant**
 - A sum of money given by an organization, especially a government, for a particular purpose.
 - State or Federal Government Money determined by financial status and academic accomplishment.
- **Work-study**
 - A college program that enables a student to work part-time while attending school.
 - State or Federal money maximum of 10 hours a week.

Types of Financial Aid...

- **Loan**
 - Money lent at an interest rate.
 - Subsidized and unsubsidized loans.

What is the difference between a subsidized and unsubsidized loan?

Subsidized loans

Are based on financial need.

Government pays interest while enrolled at least half-time

Only accept what you need!

Unsubsidized loans

Are not based on financial need

Interest accrues on loan while in school

Student responsible for paying interest

Only accept what you need!

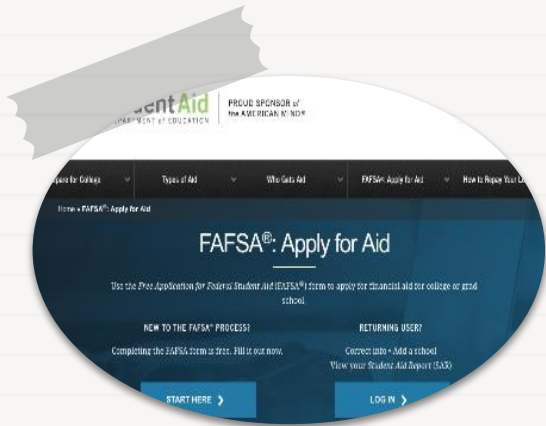

For the FAFSA...

- Before starting the FAFSA the student and parent must each create their own Federal Student Aid Identification commonly referred to as a FSA ID.
- A FSA ID serves as your username and password to access the FAFSA and your electronic signature.
- You will also use it to access your FAFSA and renew it every year.

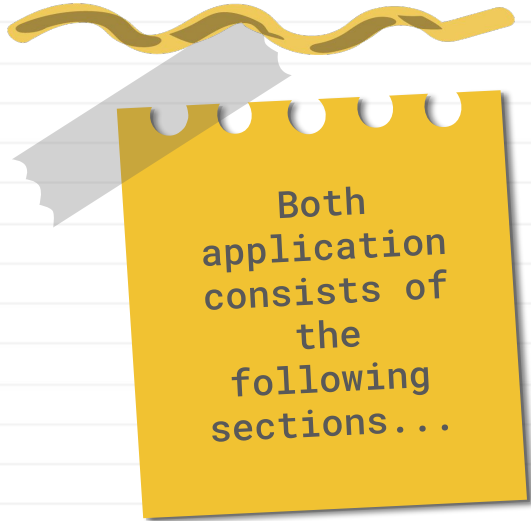

- Student's Legal Name
- Address
- Birthdate
- Social Security Number
- High School Completion Status
- What college certificate will you be working towards
- Work study (Yes)
- If you are a male, it will ask if you would like to register for the selective services (all males are required by law to register when they turn 18).
 - i. Since it's a federal law, you won't be able to receive federal financial aid if you don't register.
 - ii. If you're not 18 yet, Federal Student Aid will wait until your 18th birthday or shortly thereafter to send your registration to Selective Service.

Dependency Status

Dependent students must provide parental information, along with their own.

Independent students won't include parental information but will include their spouse, if married.

- Students will then receive a financial aid award letter around the time they receive their acceptances. A financial aid award letter is the notification that students receive informing them how much financial aid a school is willing to offer. If a student is awarded a Cal Grant they must create a profile on the CSAC website, <https://mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov/>, and accept their award.
