ITEM: SECOND QUARTER WILLIAMS REPORT – FISCAL YEAR 2020-21

(OCTOBER - DECEMBER, 2020)

Education Code section 1240(c)(2)(G) requires that the results of the visits and/or reviews be reported to the governing board of each school district at a regularly scheduled meeting held in accordance with public notification requirements.

## In summary, there are NO findings to report in the following areas:

- **1. Instructional Materials:** The instructional materials sufficiency reviews were conducted during the first quarter of the 2020-21 fiscal year as part of the *Williams* site visitation process and the findings were reported in the first quarterly reports generated in October 2020.
- **2. School Accountability Report Cards (SARC):** 2018-19 SARCs published in the 2019-20 school year were reviewed for accuracy of information pertaining to the quality, currency and availability of instructional materials, and facilities good repair. Preliminary findings were provided to districts with an opportunity for revision and resubmission, as appropriate. Upon final review, no inaccuracies were reported for any of our district's *Williams*-monitored sites.
- **3. School Facilities:** Facilities inspections were conducted at monitored sites offering in-person instruction during the first quarter of the 2020-21 fiscal year as part of the *Williams* site visitation process and applicable findings were reported in the first quarterly report generated in October 2020.
- **4. Teacher Assignments**: Following the postponement of the implementation of the new annual assignment monitoring process (California Statewide Assignment Accountability System CalSAAS) by the California Department of Education and Commission on Teacher Credentialing, the 2019-20 fiscal year review began October 1, 2020, and concluded December 30, 2020. The 2020-21 review will take place April June 2021 (90 day statute).

The following document for the 2019-20 certificated assignment monitoring findings which are considered informational only (non-consequential) as the intent was to allow for training, identification of reporting inaccuracies, and resolution of assignment issues in preparation for the consequential 2020-21 fiscal year review.

ITEM: COURSES FOR APPROVAL

Background: Education Services requests the Board of Education approve the middle and

high school courses listed below to be offered at our secondary schools during the 2021-2022 school year. These include courses in the areas of English/Language Arts, Social Studies, Career Technical Education (CTE), and Electives. These courses were approved in their curriculum committees and were approved at the February 2, 2021 Curriculum Council meeting.

## **Middle School Courses**

## **ELECTIVES**

## Public Safety I: Citizenship and Character-Building (5 credits)

Grades 7-8

This is a semester-long elective introductory Public Safety Program course which is guided by the qualities and principles of the public safety sector. This course promotes students to practice positive character traits and examines the values of being a responsible member of the community. Students will engage in an instructional program that integrates academics and technical preparation focusing on career awareness and desired personal traits within the community, public safety, and military.

## Public Safety II: Community and Leadership (5 credits)

Grades 7-8

This semester-long elective course is designed to prepare students for career and technical educational courses offered at the high school level. Students will experience the four skills of language (reading, writing, speaking, and listening) through instruction, case-study evaluations, hands-on training, and problem-based activities. This course will cultivate an environment in which students will work towards creating personal effective leadership traits and resolve conflict through critical thinking and the art of communication.

## **High School Courses**

## **ENGLISH**

## **Multicultural Literature P (10 credits)**

Grades 10

Multicultural Literature is a yearlong course designed for students interested in studying various multicultural writers and the relationship of the selected readings to each writer's cultural background. Multicultural Literature will explore different racial ethnicities in the United States, paying particular attention to how the literature explores racism, discrimination, and rises above oppression. In this literature course, students will closely examine the critical relationships of the

authors who challenged the discourse of American socio-political policy and commentary to move towards a more socially just and caring world for everyone. UC "B" designation pending.

### **SOCIAL STUDIES**

## Race & Gender in U.S. History P (10 credits)

**Grades 10** 

Race & Gender in U.S. History is a yearlong course introducing students to the turning points in the growth of America into a world power. The focus in this class is on how our founding documents created the foundation for a society based on natural rights for all. This course focuses on how different racial, ethnic, and minority groups have worked to make these rights a reality as viewed from the lens of the struggle and contributions of women, African Americans, immigrants, Mexican Americans and other minorities to become equal participants in the American experience. UC "A" designation pending.

### **CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION**

## **Advanced Cabinetmaking and Millwork P (10 credits)**

**Grades 11-12** 

This Capstone Cabinetmaking course will introduce students to the construction of high-quality finished products such as cabinets and furniture. Students will be introduced to mass production techniques and entrepreneurship as they participate in manufacturing of cabinetry and wood products. They will design, build, and test market furniture, cabinets, or wood products. Students will gain employable skills as related to the Building and Construction Trades Industry sector and will be evaluated and tested using the Woodwork Manufacturing Skills Standards. Students may also earn an OSHA 10 certificate, and complete industry recognized certifications through Precision Exams. UC "G" designation pending.

## **SUMMER SCHOOL (High School)**

## **Summer Mathematics Institute (5 elective credits)**

Grades 9-10

The 5 elective credits (9 days) Summer Mathematics Institute (SMI) prepares and supports students to excel in high school courses in mathematics and to plan for college and career. The curriculum for this course was designed by California State University, San Bernardino. Instruction will be led using EdReady, a computer based program that assesses students' readiness for college math. The program uses data to identify existing knowledge gaps and creates a personalized study plan for each student that meets their personal academic needs. The program consists of live instruction that includes problem solving, STEAM activities, and engagement activities including campus tours and college readiness workshops.

Recommendation: Approve the new courses that will be utilized by all middle and high schools

in the District beginning with the 2021-2022 school year.

Background: Art Specialties, Inc. is a local business that has worked with Rialto Unified
