Seniors Invest \$10,000

The stock market is now underway. It was opened for business March 13 in G2. The scnior problems classes, under the supervision of Mr. Eagan, has studied Economics for more than six weeks and now have a pretty good knowledge of what makes big business work. Early in the morning Mr. Eagan meets several students at Dean Whitter & Co. to famalarize them with the stock market. There the students watch the opening prices flash across the board all the way from New York. Ticker tapes are always coming in to aid the eager investor. The students must also familiarize themselves with the businesses by using the Standard and Poors books about the histories of the businesses on the New York Stock Exchange.

In the classroom are charts, which list the names of the students who are in that particular class and the 30 stocks which they may buy, ranging from Revlon to Falstaff. Daily, the students as well as Mr. Eagan, may buy and sell

stocks, according to how the market is. The brokers have to keep records of all these transactions. In return for their hard work they receive a percentage of each person's profit.

The broker for the first hour class is Miss Betty Lee and associates with Earl Mehl as assistant broker. For the fourth period class is Miss Diane Hoffman and Associates with Edward Courtney and Miss Marlyn Hill as assistants. Ken Mobley and Associates are the brokers for the last hour with June Reynolds and Ronald Hovland as assistants.

Gary Curtis also hit a homer which was his second of the season. Jack Lucas went 2 for 2.


Ron Boyer came through by striking out two men on base in the seventh inning.
