ANGER MANAGEMENT/CRISIS INTERVENTION COUNSELOR Job Description

DEFINITION

Works with special education students exhibiting anger management and crisis issues that are impeding their academic progress and threatening their student status due to possible expulsion proceedings, and/or provides counseling to students required to participate in counseling as a result of an expulsion contract. Conducts individual and group counseling sessions that address anger managements, conflict resolution, ADHD, self-esteem, gang interventions, drug and alcohol prevention, suicide, sexual abuse, self-mutilation, and other such adolescent issues.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Provide group or individual counseling to special education students required to participate in counseling as a result of an expulsion contract.
- Provide counseling for special education students, deemed by principals to be at risk due to psychological/emotional issues that are impending their academic progress and social development.
- Conduct anger management sessions to special education students requiring assistance in maintaining their temper and appropriate behavior.
- Provide group sessions on pressing adolescent issues.
- Review available data such as assessment reports prepared by other professionals and other student records.
- Collaborate with schools psychologists, teachers, administrators, instructional aides, and counselors to collect and analyze behavioral observation data and write behavior plans.
- · Participate in IEP meetings.
- Write behavior IEP goals and objectives.
- Provide in-service sessions dealing with behavior management.
- · Performs other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of and ability to:

- Knowledge and understanding of a variety of counseling and teaching procedures and techniques with demonstrated ability to counsel effectively with students, parents and teachers.
- Knowledge of school curriculum administrative procedures, and pertinent areas related to the total education program.
- Understanding of strengths and limitations of individual and group test and the ability to interpret test results to students and parents.
- Must be willing to arrange work hours to meet student and parent's needs.
- Possess a valid Class 3 California Driver's license, a private vehicle, and maintain current insurance at all times.
- · Spanish literacy skills are desired.

Experience and Education:

- Bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited college or university.
- Possession of a valid credential authorizing services as a school counselor.
- Fingerprints on file as required by State law.
- TB Skin Test as required by State law.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Physical class:

Moderate lifting - 40 pounds maximum with occasional lifting and/or carrying objects weighing up to 5 pounds.

Work area requirements:

Regular classroom, in the common areas, parking lot, bus stop areas and possibly field trips. Ability to use common school hand tools, computer, telephone and photocopy machine. Ability to transverse any part of a 10 acre campus which would include asphalt, sidewalks, grass on playgrounds, dirt, and bus areas.

Physical requirements:

The time requirements are listed considering this wording and meaning:

Occasionally/low - up to 3 hours; Frequently/Medium - 3 to 6 hours; Constantly/High - 6 to 8 hours

Stooping: Occasionally Carrying: Frequently

Bending: Occasionally Standing: 0-30 minutes to 1 hour

Lifting: Occasionally Kneeling: Not required

Reaching: Occasionally Sitting: 0 or may sit 60 minutes a day

Handling: Frequently *Driving: Must have ability to get to in-service meeting

Crouching: Occasionally Walking: Frequently - up to 4 ½ hours a day

Grasping: Frequently Push/Pull: Occasionally

Fingering: Occasionally

*Possession of a current California Driver's license, a DMV printout and the ability to be covered by the company auto insurance is required.

Frequent motion:
