INDEPENDENT STUDY TEACHER ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL

DEFINITION

Under the supervision and direction of the school site Principal. The independent study teacher provides an individualized program of instruction through Independent Study in all academic areas with students in K-8th grade and other duties as assigned.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- Works with Site Administration in planning and implementing an individualized academic program for each student enrolled in the Independent Study program;
- Prepares and teaches individualized course work which meets the requirements in the areas of math, English, reading, Social Studies, science, and other subjects consistent with a personalized educational plan;
- Determines instructional materials designed to achieve instructional goals and behavioral objectives. Selects books appropriate to the interest and maturity levels of pupils;
- Ascertaining the achievement level of each student through testing, investigation of previous records, professional opinion, or any other methods deemed necessary;
- Evaluates each pupil's progress in courses and prepares progress reports;
- Promotes and encourages a positive attitude towards school on the part of the students;
- Maintains professional competence through participation in in-service education activities provided by the district and/or in self-selected professional growth activities, and knowledge of and familiarity with Rialto School District's programs;
- Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Curriculum, instruction, and assessment processes and how they should operate in an effective independent study program.
- Technology and computer software applications relative to instruction and administration.
- Social resources including but not limited to material resources, learning centers and vendor course instruction.

- Plan and teach individualized lessons for one-to-one instruction.
- Understand, accept and work individual differences in students and parent(s)/guardian(s).
- Effectively work with and relate to students with independent education needs and their parent(s)/guardian(s).
- Establish and maintain cooperative relationships with students, parent(s)/guardian(s), all school staff, vendors, and the public.
- Communicate effectively in the English language both orally and in writing.
- Meet required schedules and timelines.
- Maintain detailed records and student folders.
- Be highly organized.
- Work independently.
- Analyze situations accurately and adopt and appropriate and effective course of action.
- Learn and use technology and computer software applications efficiently as appropriate to the work environment.
- Use tact, patience, and courtesy when dealing with all people.

- Use positive professional demeanor as well as initiative and judgment while discussing problems with students, parent(s)/guardian(s), staff and the public involving student portfolios, information or performance, school policies or practices while maintaining appropriate confidentiality.
- Understand and be sensitive to those of culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.
- Maintain a valid Standard First Aid and CPR certificate.
- Possess a California driver's license and be insured.
- Maintain a positive professional demeanor and appropriate confidentiality at all times.
