

What is the LCAP?


The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) and Annual Update Template documents and communicates local educational agencies' (LEAs) actions and expenditures to support student outcomes and overall performance.

Law was passed in 2013 for the funding and first implemented during the 2014-15 school year.

Executive Order from Gov. Gavin Newsom - April 2020

Due by

- "Local educational agencies, including school districts, will publish a written report to their communities that explains how they have responded to COVID-19, including steps they have taken to deliver distance learning and meet the needs of disadvantaged students ."



- *Order extends the deadlines for completing annual planning processes to enable local educational agencies to prioritize more exigent needs.*







- Signed into law on by Gov. Gavin Newsom on June 29, 2020
- Includes requirements regarding distance learning and in-person instruction, among other topics, for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Established need to create the “**Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan**”

Covid-19 State/County Updates



Due by
September
30, 2020

STATE: On **Friday, July 17, 2020**, California Governor **Gavin Newsom** took action related to the opening of schools for the upcoming school year. He announced that schools in Counties that are on the COVID-19 watch list will start the year with Distance Learning. In-person instruction may resume only when a county, currently on the watch list, is off the watch list, for 14 consecutive days.

COUNTY: San Bernardino County is on the COVID-19 watch list. Therefore, the Rialto Unified School District will start the 2020-2021 school year with Distance Learning. The new school year will begin on **Monday, August 10, 2020**. Updates continue to be communicated via, phones/text message and website: www.rialto.k12.ca.us



Requirements for Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan

- Must address the following:
 - Student access to Internet connectivity and devices to participate in the educational program.
 - Quality, challenging content aligned to grade level standards equivalent to in-person instruction.
 - Supports to address the needs of students.
 - Special education, related services, and accommodations required by an individualized education program.
 - Designated and integrated instruction in English language development.
 - Daily live interaction with certificated employees and peers






