Review of ELAC Officer Roles

OFFICERS for ELAC

CHAIRPERSON

- Preside at all meetings.
- Sign all letters, reports and other communications of the council/committee.
- Perform all duties relevant to the office of the Chairperson.
- Participate in planning of meeting agendas.
- Have other such duties as are prescribed by council/committee.

Note: Only the ELAC Chairperson will serve as the school's representative to the Local District ELAC Delegate Convening. (No alternate, including the Vice Chairperson, will be allowed to participate in the Delegate Convening).

PARLIAMENTARIAN

- Assist the Chairperson in ensuring all rules and bylaws are followed.
- Be knowledgeable about the California
 Open Meeting Law (Greene Act), District
 policies, bylaws of the council/committee,
 and selected parliamentary procedures.
- · Participate in planning of the agenda.

VICE-CHAIRPERSON

- Represent the Chairperson in assigned duties.
- Substitute for the Chairperson in his or her absence, except at Delegate Convening.
- · Participate in planning of the agenda.

SECRETARY

- · Conduct roll call to establish quorum.
- Keep minutes of all regular and special meetings of the council/committee.
- Provide the signed and dated original meeting minutes to the principal or designee.
- Assist in keeping the records of the council/committee.
- Maintain a current roster of the council/committee members.
- Perform other such duties as are assigned by the Chairperson.
- Participate in the planning of the agenda.





Steps to Reclassification



For English Language Learners (ELLs)

Reclassification:

The final step for an ELL student to be considered fluent in English.



To reclassify, ELLs must:

Receive an overall score of 4 on the ELPAC (California's test of English proficiency, administered in the spring)

Be at or near grade level in reading, based on the Reading Inventory or i-Ready assessment.

Receive a sufficient ELA grade

Reclassification process:

The **ELPAC** includes four subtests to assess students' skills in speaking, listening,

reading and writing.

In addition, students must meet Basic Skills cut points via the Reading Inventory or i-Ready test.

The ELL Snapshot explains how close your student is to reclassification, Parents. teachers, and students can use it together to set goals.


