FIRE

IF A FIRE ERRUPTS, immediately CALL 9-1-1. Any time there is a fire on campus, of ANY size, the Fire Department must be called. The following procedures should be activated for a Fire at a school or district facility. Call 9-1-1 and then call the Site Administrator and supply any known details.

TREAT ALL ALARMS LIKE A REAL EMERGENCY. DO NOT ASSUME IT'S A FALSE ALARM. THE ALARM MAY NOT SOUND CONTINUOUSLY. IF THE ALARM STOPS, CONTINUE TO EVACUATE

- 1. Walk, <u>DO NOT RUN</u>, to the nearest safe exit. <u>DO NOT PUSH OR CROWD</u>. Provide clear direction to students and visitors.
- 2. Provide assistance to those persons with access and functional needs.
- 3. Use stairways and handrails and keep to the right. DO NOT USE ELEVATORS.
- 4. Feel doors bottom to top for heat using the back of your hand. <u>IF HOT DO NOT OPEN DOOR</u>. If not hot, open the door slowly standing behind and to one side. Be prepared to close quickly if fire is present.
- 5. Proceed to Evacuation Assembly Area and take roll.
- 6. Refer to "Critical Incident Response Plan and Evacuation Map."
- 7. Follow directions of the Site Administrator.
- 8. Notify Safety Dispatch (909) 820-6892 as soon as possible.
