Parent Responsibilities

- Making sure that homework is completed and submitted (online or in-person) depending on the instructional model.
- Ensure that student(s) attend after-school student support services (i.e., SEL counseling and/or academic support/tutoring).
- Monitoring the amount of television/video game screen time that our child/children watch and play.
- Monitoring child/children's use of social media.
- Ensuring that our child/children are on time.
- Participating in decisions relating to my child's/children's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's/children's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's/children's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices sent to me or my child/children from the school or the school district, via email or mail, and responding as appropriate.
- Notifying the school promptly upon any change of personal contact information (i.e., phone numbers, emails, address, etc.).
- Serving, to the extent possible, on parent advisory groups, such as being a parent representative on the school's School Site Council, English Learners Advisory Committee, or the African-American Parent Advisory Council.

- Participating in at least one parent event per quarter. Examples- Monthly parent nights, Science Night, Back to School Night, and Open House (whether online or in-person).

- Self-monitor and regulate my screen time daily with videogames and social media.
- Actively participate in school, whether online or in-person.

- Give to my parents, or the adult who is responsible for my welfare, all notices and information received by me from my school every day.
