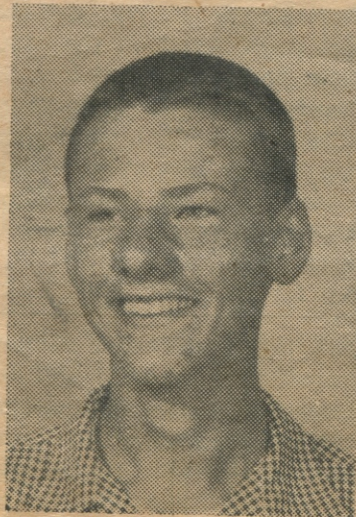
Sophomore Treasurer is Ellen Langill.
